

1ST QUARTER DISASTER REPORT Year 2016

I. INTRODUCTION:

For the 1st quarter, the department through the disaster management unit has been responding to disaster response as far as augmentation support to the respective local government units within Region IX.

Along recovery program for IDPs in Zamboanga City, the DSWD Field office IX continously monitored the rehabilitation program in the different transitory sites and facilitated the pay- out of financial assistance funded by NHA to families awarded for permanent shelters, despite the camp management/operation has been transfered to the City Government since April 2015.

Presently, the Region is on the process of assesing the request of LGUs for the augmentation support to the affected families brought about the effects of the El Nino Phenomenon in coordination with the REGION IX SPECIAL EL NINO TASK FORCE (SETF), as to prevent duplication of assistance provided by different agencies to the affected sectors in the Municipalities.
