Programs & Services

HOME FOR THE ELDERLY



SPIRITUAL LIFE SERVICES – provision of opportunities for religious practices and spiritual enrichment/value inculcation activities for the residents/clients.

PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES – provision of initial assessment to all clients in the center, conduct of counseling sessions to individual/group clients, and referral of clients to other mental facilities.

PHYSICAL THERAPY SERVICES – provide services that help restore function, improve mobility, relieve pain, and prevent or limit permanent physical disabilities in clients with injury or disease.

PALLIATIVE CARE – provision of basic health care to clients with special health and physical needs.

TRANSPORTATION SERVICES – provision of transportation assistance to senior citizen who will be returning to their families/relatives to their place of origin.

AFTER-CARE SERVICES – referrals to concerned DSWD-FOs and LGUs shall be undertaken to facilitate reintegration to his/her family/other relatives and community, for follow-up and provision of community-based services.
